Good News... Forgiveness...

Last month 21 year-old Dylann Storm Roof killed nine people at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, South Carolina. The victims were attending a Prayer Meeting/Bible Study class.

The all black church had lovingly welcomed Dylann into their midst, even though Dylann was white. Dylann participated in the Prayer Meeting for more than an hour and then suddenly pulled out a gun and started shooting. He explained that he had to do something about the black problem in the U.S. because no one else was doing anything.

Many of us were not surprised when we heard of the shootings because we have sadly become accustomed to mass killings in schools, theaters, shopping malls, marathons, airplanes, airports etc. The shock factor was missing because we have to expect such craziness from time to time.

Roof was a high school dropout who abused alcohol and used illegal drugs. Somehow he became exposed to racist philosophies and committed this horrible hate crime.

What is amazing to me is the response of the black congregation. Nearly all of the victims' families said that even though Roof had inflicted unbearable and irreversible harm to them, they forgive him.

One might expect rioting in the streets or other types of demonstrations, but no—forgiveness.

Why? These people were Christians. They were full of love, not hate. They weren't pretend Christians or so-called nominal Christians. They were legitimate followers of Jesus Christ and under the absolute worst circumstances they were still able to forgive. Thank God for such witnesses.

Roof either had a mental illness or allowed Satan access to his mind and made terrible choices. Either way, legitimate followers of Christ could forgive.

The Good News is that God loves and forgives us even more!

GC Session Cost

The General Conference World Budget each year sets aside \$1.4 million for the direct cost of the Session venue. That's \$7 million (every 5 years), which is less than 8 cents a year per member. Including indirect costs, such as air travel, lodging and programs of local administrative units, the total cost for the Session is about \$20 million, which is approximately one dollar per member, per year.

Recycling


