Good News... Battery Chargers ...

I did it. I just bought my first electric car. I purchased a Nissan Leaf. I love the car. It is so quiet. I never have to have a tune-up or oil change. I don't have to worry about gasoline prices rising to \$4 or more a gallon and I can go in the carpool lane even when I don't have other passengers in the vehicle. I can also feel good about being environmentally responsible—zero emissions.

Having an electric car does have its downside, however. Driving the car to Las Vegas or San Diego would take some planning. I can only go 108 miles per charge. So if I needed to go on a road trip, I'd have to stop at a quick charge station and spend 25 minutes to get charged-up again for another 108 miles. Thankfully, quick charge stations are becoming more and more numerous. The other option would be to take my other (gasoline) car. That's what I'd probably do.

It takes me 6 hours to totally charge my car at home. Most days I don't drive more than 108 miles. So when I get home at night I just plug in and in the morning I'm ready to go again.

If I need to, I can also plug in at my office since the office has 220 volt electrical service.

Having an electric car takes some getting used to. I find myself watching the mileage gauge often. I don't want to run out of juice and get stranded.

The whole experience reminds me of our need for Christ. To operate effectively, we need to daily get charged-up. This is usually done through Bible Study, prayer and quiet time. If I don't do this, I run out of gas (I mean electricity).

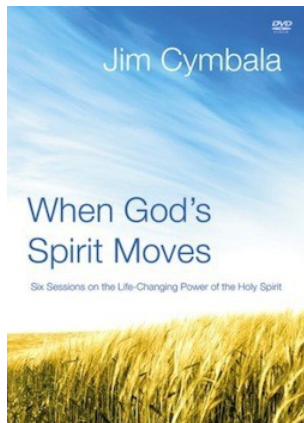
I would liken going to church to getting a quick charge. Every person needs a weekly quick charge. Collective worship gives you that something extra that keeps you going.

This month Pastor Ken begins a sermon series entitled *The Writings of God*. On the 18th we will have a special Father's Day emphasis.

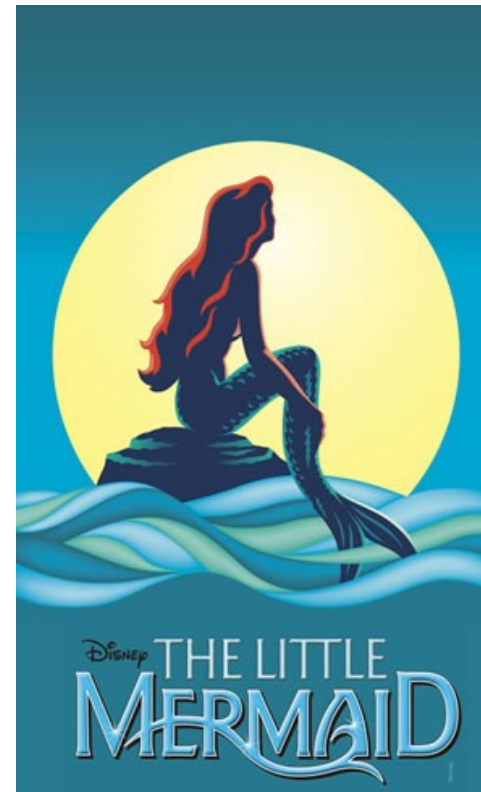

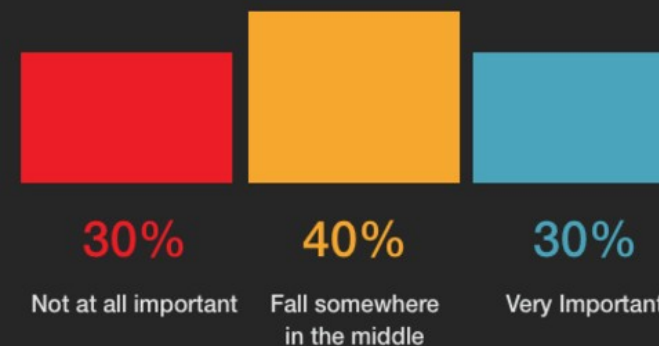


Little Mermaid Sunday, June 26, 7 PM La Mirada Theatre
